## **Living in St. Jerome's, El Cerrito Everything is just a few blocks away.....**

The St. Jerome's neighborhood enjoys a wonderful mix of longtime residents and young professional families who treasure this small four block radius bordering Albany. St. Jerome's can't be beat for convenience. It's two blocks off of Memorial Park in Albany and Solano Avenue is just beyond. It's a short walk to Fat Apple's for breakfast, pastries, apple pie, lunch or dinner, or to the Colusa Circle with its corner grocery store, Semifreddi's Bakery, and The Pub.

El Cerrito hosts a local farmer's market twice a week at El Cerrito Plaza, which is also home to major chains including Trader Joe's, Barnes & Noble, Pier One, and popular eateries including Jamba Juice and Pasta Pomodoro. There's a BART stop across from the Plaza. Remnants of "old El Cerrito" can still be found on San Pablo Avenue where merchants include internationally famous Down Home Music specializing in acoustic and folk music and the beloved Pastime Hardware. The Cerrito Theater, with its elegant 1930's era art deco murals, reopened last year.

St. Jerome's houses, built in the 30s and 40s, have lots of charm and display beautiful gardens. El Cerrito's excellent city services, parks and recreational facilities, proximity to Berkeley and the Gourmet Ghetto, and breezy commute into the City make it a "10" for the best buy in the East Bay.
